# Christian Girls' High School Kasur

### History:

The small city of Kasur is located south of Lahore, along the border with India. The daily border closing ceremony draws many tourists. Christian Girls' High School (CGHS) Kasur was established in 1902 and was nationalized by the government of the Punjab in 1972. After a long legal battle, the Pakistani Government returned most of the 7-acre campus back to the Presbyterian Education Board in September 2000. At that time, there were only 115 students at the school and the academic standards were very low, with only a 13% pass rate for 10th-grade state exams. The school had no furniture, electricity or bathrooms.

### Today:

There are now nearly 700 students studying at CGHS Kasur. 64% of the students are Christian, many coming from low-income homes. The school is open to both boys and girls through grade 5, and to girls for grades 6 to 10. In 2017 100% of the 10th grade students passed the state exams. Students are encouraged to reach their full potential in academic studies and develop in character in line with the school's core values of self-discipline, tolerance, integrity, and respect. Thanks to generous U.S. friends, CGHS Kasur has recently been able to add new colorful playground equipment, refurbished Nursery and Kindergarten classrooms, and computer labs.



### Looking Ahead...Our Dreams/Our Future:

Our greatest need is for scholarships to help deserving students who are unable to afford tuition. New classrooms, furniture, bathroom facilities, and security measures are also needed.
